Dear Friends in Christ,



The resource table in the Commons is back. On loan resources for September pertain to the topic of *faith and mental health*. Some of the resources




contain personal narratives of persons suffering from various mental illnesses. Other resources promote care and promotion of mental health from the perspective of faith. **Welcome!**

worship services. All root vegetables will be harvested, weighed, boxed and delivered to local food pantries. All ages are welcome.

Monthly Collection Results

- May: Diapers and feminine hygiene products—852 diapers, 387 sanitary pads and 86 tampons were delivered to Philadelphia Diaper Bank
- June: Laundry supplies—19 containers of detergent pods and 8 boxes of dryer sheets were donated to the HOPE Laundry ministry
- July: Christmas in July—a total of \$1,245 was donated to the outreach ministries of the ELCA including Lutheran Disaster Response, World Hunger, Eastern Europe/Ukraine Crisis Response, International Women Leaders, and AMMPARO
- July 500 Challenge: We made 99+% of our goal to collect 500 items of nonperishable food in one month. We delivered 497 items to the local pantries during July! Thank you for your generosity.
